#### **Accelerated Reader**

- Program for comprehension students read a book and take a quiz on the computer. Each quiz is 10 questions. The quizzes help the teachers to know the child's specific reading level.
- Passing is 7/10. Students may take a quiz up to 3 times.
- Each book has an assigned point value.
- Goal for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade is 35 points.



 Students may take quizzes before 8:30, during Language workcycle, and during homework workcycle. Students are not allowed to take quizzes at home.


- Sentence writing and writing activities are completed in the spelling notebook.

## Classwork- Language

#### Vocabulary Workshop

- Students are introduced to units throughout the year, for a total of 14 units.
- Students read vocabulary words then complete different activities to help understand the meanings.



#### Homework – Language (Cont.)

#### Read each night

- It is important for students to read daily to build fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary.
- Students may read anything they like including Accelerated Reader books, other books, magazines, or newspapers.

- Morning Routine any work not completed in class is to be finished for homework.
  - Students have 15-30 minutes daily to complete Morning Routine work.
  - Assigned pages are listed in the planner. Morning Routine is assigned daily, for a total of 4 days per week.

#### **Book Reports**

- There will be three (3) at-home book reports assigned December, February and May.
- A book discussion will be held on the date listed on the handout. The book should also be tested and passed on within this time.
- Book reports templates will be given out on the discussion date.
- Students will have one full week to complete the rough draft, with the final draft due the following week.
